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How to get medical insurance if you do not already have it

Note: Under the Affordable Care Act, insurance companies cannot ask about or consider pre-existing conditions when deciding how much to charge you or offer you coverage.

Obtaining New Health Insurance: Marketplace Health Insurance. If you are unable to obtain employer-provided health insurance, have recently stopped working, had some other major life change, and/or do not qualify for Medicaid or Medicare, you may be able to purchase a health insurance policy through an insurance company or broker, or through the state or federal health insurance Marketplace. Individuals who choose plans in the Marketplace may be eligible for financial assistance. Contact them at (800) 318-2596, or online at: www.HealthCare.gov/get-coverage

Medicare is a federal health insurance program, which provides coverage to individuals who are entitled to Social Security retirement benefits and are 65 years of age or older, individuals who are under the age of 65, but have been receiving Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) for no less than 24 months, individuals entitled to Railroad Retirement benefits or Railroad Retirement disability benefits, individuals with end-stage renal disease (ESRD), and individuals with Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS). You may be eligible to receive both Medicare and Medicaid benefits if you are over 65, or disabled and have very limited income. Medicaid might cover what Medicare does not. Health Coverage for Low Income Households: Medicaid is a federal health insurance program with eligibility criteria and benefits that vary from state to state. Thirty-one states provide coverage for low income adults, while in other states individuals have to meet other requirements, such as having a disability, having a dependent child, or being over age 65. You may be eligible to receive both Medicare and Medicaid benefits if you are over 65 and/or disabled and have very limited income. Medicaid might cover what Medicare does not. Keeping Health Insurance after Terminating Employment: COBRA may allow you to maintain health insurance coverage if you experience a qualifying event, such as leaving your job. Learn more at:

EMPLOYMENT ISSUES

Taking Time Off Work

The Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA) gives eligible employees the right to up to 3 months of unpaid, job- and health-benefit protected leave per year. Even if you do not qualify for FMLA, you may be eligible for medical leave under state law or the rules of your specific employer. You may check with your company's human resource representative or one of these organizations:

Staying Employed During & After Medical Treatment: Exhausting Medical Leave or Sick Time

Some cancer patients may opt to continue working during treatments, others may need flexible schedules, and some need time off. Workers may be protected, depending on the size of their employer, by: (1) the FMLA described above, (2) the Americans with Disabilities Act (the "ADA"), and/or (3) the fair employment laws of certain states for employees with disabilities at very small businesses.

Finding Local Housing

City of Richmond Office on Aging and Disability Services, Rent Relief for Immigrant Families - The City of Richmond's Office of Multicultural Affairs offers a program to provide rent and mortgage assistance to non-citizen and mixed immigration status households in Richmond. This program is designed to support those Richmonders excluded from federal assistance due to their immigration status. To assist as many households as possible, funds per household will be limited to \$1,500, or up to two months of rent, whichever is less. This support program is intended to aid households who are having trouble paying rent due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. Applicants who have not received any other cash assistance throughout the pandemic will be given priority. Contact them at (804) 646-0145.

Housing Resource Line. The Housing Resource Line is a program of the Partnership for Affordable Housing. The organization will connect people to needed housing-related resources in the Richmond area. When you dial 2-1-1, a trained professional listens to your situation and suggests sources of help using one of the largest databases of health and human services in Virginia.

It provides 24-hour staff supervision, with the ultimate goal of establishing a medical home and attaining stable housing. The discharging facility can refer the patient to the Medical Respite facility. This process generally takes 24 hours. Housing Choice Voucher Program allows qualifying prospective tenants to select from a wider range of housing options, as opposed to being limited to designated housing projects. The tenant pays the landlord a percentage of their monthly income towards the rent, with the voucher subsidizing the remainder.


