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ABOUT CANCERLINC

CancerLINC is a Richmond nonprofit that 'LINC's cancer patients and their families to legal, financial, and community resources to solve the non-medical obstacles that arise with a cancer diagnosis.

CancerLINC services are always free, and the professional services provided by our volunteers are free to patients who live below the federally-defined poverty level.

CancerLINC was formed in 1996 by two local attorneys, Phyllis Katz and Ann Hodges (both cancer survivors), when they realized a need exists to help patients experiencing nonmedical issues related to cancer diagnoses and treatment. Our network of volunteers is comprised of over 200 attorneys and financial advisors who are making a difference in the lives of cancer patients and their families throughout Central Virginia.

Over the last 26 years, it is estimated that more than 10,000 patients and their families have received assistance from CancerLINC.

A YEAR OF PROGRESS AND GROWTH

Dear friends, supporters and partners,

We are proud to present this report of our services and activities for Fiscal Year 2023. It was a very successful twelve months of growth in our services for patients and a year of sustained organizational progress.

Most significant was the incredible increase in the number of local cancer patients and families served. 693 patients requested our help, representing an increase of over 26% compared to the previous year and 73% growth over the span of the last five years!

Unfortunately, cancer patients are facing additional non-medical challenges due to prolonged effects of the pandemic and recent rising costs of basic needs. While we primarily help patients with legal and financial issues, more recently we have responded to increasing requests for help with basic needs.

Of the 815 patient issues we addressed last year, 32% were requests for resource needs, such as food, rent and utility assistance, transportation, and health copay expenses. In response, we connected these patients with a network of local community resource organizations for assistance.

Consistent with last year, 91% of the patients we served live below the federal poverty level, and 77% were 50 years old or older. We are a vital resource for vulnerable populations of cancer patients in our community that do not have the financial ability to seek legal assistance or financial guidance.

Twenty-five new attorneys and financial professionals joined our list of volunteers – a 14% increase. This group of 200 professionals assisted patients with 313 legal and financial matters requiring an estimated 3,717 pro bono service hours valued at approximately \$942,245.

Patient and family satisfaction with our services remained high. Their expressions of relief and gratitude for the help we provide further motivates our work. Of note, 92% responded that the assistance they received will help make future legal and financial decisions easier for their family, and 93% said our services allowed them to focus more time and energy on their health.

Operationally, the committees and Board refined our strategic plan that will guide us for the next three years. Our financial status improved due to increased revenue from our fundraising events and prudent fiscal management practices. We established a Marketing & Communications Committee to guide our efforts in reaching more patients and raising general awareness of our services. This, coupled with a new website and energized social media presence is extending our messaging to the larger connected community.

Our employees are our "secret sauce."
Their dedication, compassion, and dogged determination to help those in need is unmatched.

To complement their daily work, our Board of Directors is strong, active and generously donates time and talents to further the mission and services of CancerLINC.

We encourage you to review the information included in this report and partner with us as we continue to serve as a vital resource for patients and families at a critical time in their lives. Our impact in helping cancer patients and their families is growing thanks to your involvement and support.


