# **PAYING FOR MEDICAL CARE**


#### How to get medical insurance if you do not already have it

**Note:** Under the Affordable Care Act, insurance companies cannot ask about or consider pre-existing conditions when deciding how much to charge you or offer you coverage.

**Obtaining New Health Insurance: Marketplace Health Insurance.** If you are unable to obtain employer-provided health insurance, have recently stopped working, had some other major life change, and/or do not qualify for Medicaid or Medicare, you may be able to purchase a health insurance policy through an insurance company or broker, or through the state or federal health insurance Marketplace. Individuals who choose plans in the Marketplace may be eligible for financial assistance. Contact them at (800) 318-2596, or online at: www.HealthCare.gov/get-coverage

**Medicare** is a federal health insurance program, which provides coverage to individuals who are entitled to Social Security retirement benefits and are 65 years of age or older, individuals who are under the age of 65, but have been receiving Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) for no less than 24 months, individuals entitled to Railroad Retirement benefits or Railroad Retirement disability benefits, individuals with end-stage renal disease (ESRD), and individuals with Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS). You may be eligible to receive both Medicare and Medicaid benefits if you are over 65, or disabled and have very limited income. Medicaid might cover what Medicare does not. **Health Coverage for Low Income Households: Medicaid** is a federal health insurance program with eligibility criteria and benefits that vary from state to state. Thirty-one states provide coverage for low income adults, while in other states individuals have to meet other requirements, such as having a disability, having a dependent child, or being over age 65. You may be eligible to receive both Medicare and Medicaid benefits if you are over 65 and/or disabled and have very limited income. Medicaid might cover what Medicare does not. 

VICAP counsels individuals on Medicare, Medicaid, Medigap, and Long Term Care insurance. Counselors work with clients to make informed decisions about Medicare Supplement Insurance, Medicare plans, and Medicare Part D Prescription Drug coverage plans. Counselors can also assist eligible clients with tracking insurance claims and resolving complaints. Counseling can be provided by telephone or in-person. **Common Help** has a quick and easy screening tool to help people in VA find out if they will be eligible to receive: help with buying food (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), food stamps); Low or no-cost health care; Help with buying prescription drugs; help with paying for childcare; home energy assistance; temporary cash assistance for families with minor children (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)). This screening tool takes about 15 mins and is confidential and secure.

**Social Security Administration** provides benefits to: (1) individuals & family members who have worked long enough & paid taxes (SSDI) & (2) low income individuals with a disability (SSI), as well as to other qualifying individuals for benefits such as a Medical Vocational Allowance and a Compassionate Allowance (just by diagnosis). 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provides financial assistance to individuals with a diagnosis of cancer to help with cost-shares for covered services prescribed by behavioral health providers (psychiatrists, psychologists and licensed social workers). Applicants must be insured residents of the USA with a total household income not to exceed 500% of Federal Poverty Level. Maximum award is \$2000 per year. # **EMPLOYMENT ISSUES**

#### **Taking Time off Work**

**The Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA)** gives eligible employees the right to up to 3 months of unpaid, job- and health-benefit protected leave per year. Even if you do not qualify for FMLA, you may be eligible for medical leave under state law or the rules of your specific employer.
